WESTERN GATEWAY ELEMENTARY SCHOOL RETURN TO LEARN PLAN 2021-2022 A MULTI-FACETED APPROACH TO KEEP OUR SCHOOL OPEN AND PREVENT FUTURE COVID SHUTDOWNS

5 DAYS A WEEK

- School will be in session 5 days a week
- Western Gateway Elementary School (WGES) will not offer a virtual option for any grade level
- School start times will remain the same

MASKS ARE ENCOURAGED

- In compliance with Senate Bill 658, masks are optional (and encouraged) unless Oklahoma County is declared a state of emergency and in consultation with the county and state health departments
- If declared a state of emergency, WGES will determine if a mask mandate is necessary

COVID PRECAUTIONS AND CLEANING

- WGES will provide students and staff with personal hygiene education as a preventative measure
- Social distancing is encouraged when space allows
- Students will not be restricted to pods
- Hand sanitizer will be available and encouraged for use
- Electrostatic sprayers will be used in classrooms as needed, especially during flu season

COVID CASES & CONTACT TRACING

- WGES will track the number of positive COVID cases reported in the county
- Contact tracing will not take place unless directed by the county health department
- Vaccinations are encouraged but not required for those eligible
- COVID testing will be offered for employees and students as long as the demand for testing warrants keeping a testing site open

VIRTUAL MEETINGS & REMOTE LEARNING

- If school is closed due to COVID, inclement weather, or other extraordinary circumstances, virtual learning may be instituted
- Virtual parent / teacher conferences and IEP / 504 meetings will be offered to parents who cannot or choose not to attend in person

BREAKFAST & LUNCH

- Students will resume breakfast and lunch as they were prior to COVID
- Students will eat in the cafeteria
- Breakfast and lunch are free to all students for the '21-'22 school year and will be provided if school is closed due to COVID
- Guests at lunch will be limited to special occasions set by the school

PARENT, GUESTS & VISITORS

- Visitors and guests will be allowed in the building for programs and other special events
- All visitors and guests must check in at the front office
- School community meetings and volunteers are welcomed in the building and on field trips

OTHER INFO

- Students with disabilities will be provided services based upon their IEP or 504 educational plan
- Field trips will be allowed based on the procedures that were in place pre-COVID
- Recesses will resume as they were prior to COVID
- YMCA will continue to provide before & after school services

2021-2022 MASK REQUIREMENTS

GREEN 0-2% per site

Masks welcome & encouraged, not required; follow typical school procedures, no changes necessary.

YELLOW 2.1-3% per site

Masks welcome & encouraged, not required; follow typical school procedures, no changes necessary.

ORANGEI 3.1%-4% per site

Masks will be required in hallways, upon entering / exiting buildings, and in large group settings. Masks will be recommended in classrooms.

ORANGE II 4.1% - 5% per site

required at all times.

Masks will be

RED 5% + per site

School shutdown for 10 calendar days.

STUDENT SYMPTOMS DECISION-MAKING FOR POTENTIAL COVID-19 SYMPTOMS OR EXPOSURE

Low-risk: general symptoms

Fever (100.4F or higher) Headache Prolonged Sore throat

Nausea / vomiting / diarrhea Congestion / runny nose Fatigue / muscle or body aches

High-risk: red flag symptoms Difficulty breathing

EXPOSURE TO COVID-19 POSITIVE PERSON?

Close contact: less than 6 feet, 15 minutes or longer

NO

Has 1 low-risk symptom present - STOP - Contact Parent or Guardian/ Send home - return to school 24 hours after symptom resolution (without fever reducing medicine)

Has 2 or more low-risk symptoms present

OR 1 high-risk symptom present - STOP - Contact Parent or Guardian/ send home - Evaluation by health care provider

1. Health care provider confirms alternative diagnosis for symptoms. A note from health care provider must be on file. COVID test not needed - return to school after 24 hours without fever and symptoms improving

2. Negative SARS-CoV-2 PCR test - return to school after 24 hours without fever and symptoms improving

3. Positive SARS-CoV-2 PCR test or no provider visit or test - return to school only after 10 days since symptom onset and 24 hours without fever. Quarantine close contacts of confirmed cases. Contact local health care provider with questions.

YES

STOP - stay home* - return to school after 10 days from last contact, unless symptoms develop. If symptoms develop, perform SARS-CoV-2 PCR test
